







Market-Oriented Value Chains for Jobs and Growth in the ECOWAS Region (MOVE-ComCashew)

Sierra Leone - Country Report

1.Promoting Competitiveness of the Cashew Value Chain.

The Market Oriented Value Chains for Jobs and Growth in the ECOWAS Region (MOVE-ComCashew) is commissioned by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ). MOVE-ComCashew is cofinanced by the European Union (EU) under the Samoa agreement with the Organization of African, Caribbean, and Pacific States (OACPS) and by BMZ. MOVE-ComCashew operationalizes component 1 of EU's framework program for support to OACPS members' agriculture value chains development.

The impact of ComCashew since its inception in 2009, recorded 712,000 new jobs created in cashew production, processing, and trade, across project countries and over 790,000 farmers were trained on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Farmer Business School (FBS) from 2009 to 2020 resulting in higher productivity, diversified and higher incomes in implementing countries.



Sierra Leone has favorable ecological conditions for cashew cultivation, ranging from a tropical climate with warm temperatures and sunny conditions for many months to a rainy season spanning from April/May to October/November with an annual average rainfall of about 2,746 millimeters (mm). The country offers extensive arable land, the greater proportion of which is either underutilized or not utilized at all. Given this fact, the government has recognized cashew as an alternative cash crop to diversify agriculture and export with the aim of boosting the economy.

5. Ongoing Activities

MOVE-ComCashew supports the development of the cashew sector in Sierra Leone, on demand basis and in synergy with ongoing activities in the country. Activities ongoing and suggested for include:

- Conducting of Yield Survey and Economic case study with farmers.
- Mother tree selection and establish germoplasm, scion bank and clonal gardens.
- Continue support to MAF to boost cashew production through nurseries, production and distribution of seedlings and farmer trainings.
- Facilitating Sierra Leone's integration into regional networks (Consultative International Cashew Council - CICC, research network -REDAA, Industry association- ACA, etc.)
- Establishment of cashew demo plots in three locations in Port Loko district for polyclonal cashew seeds production and GAP trainings
- Establishment of three one-stop Cashew centres for Improved Planting material Development and distribution
